John Riddoch Cabernet Sauvignon 2009

First made in 1982, the John Riddoch Cabernet Sauvignon was conceived as a flagship wine for the Wynns portfolio. The wine honours pastoralist and parliamentarian, John Riddoch, who was the largest land-owner in South Australia's south-east corner. With his brother George, the two owned the freehold to more than 70,000 acres.

John Riddoch Cabernet Sauvignon is made in small quantities from the best available fruit grown on the estate's extensive Cabernet plantings. It has become a definitive Coonawarra Cabernet Sauvignon, made only in years when grapes of extraordinarily high quality are available using less than one percent of the top Cabernet grapes.

Nose

Broods in the glass before opening up to dark cherry, mint, and rich chocolate notes.

Palate

A solid but stylish palate with classical ripe Cabernet flavours of black cherries, dark forest fruits and subtle violets. Framing, fine & structural tannins are matched by rich dark, linear fruit. Subtle, fragrant French oak enhances the texture and lingers well after the last mouthful.
